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

## ■ Riyad-us-Saliheen

Compiled by Imam Abu Zakariyya Yahya ibn Sharaf al-Nawawi (d. 676 AH), *Riyad-us-Saliheen* — "Gardens of the Righteous" — is among the most beloved Hadith compilations in the Sunni world. Drawing from Sahih al-Bukhari, Sahih Muslim, and other canonical collections, it covers every dimension of a Muslim's life, from sincerity of intention to the etiquette of eating, sleeping, and social relations.

## ■ Fazail-e-Aamal

Authored by Shaykhul Hadith Moulana Muhammad Zakariyya Kandhlawi (d. 1402 AH), *Fazail-e-Aamal* is a treasured collection designed to inspire Muslims toward consistent worship and good deeds. Covering the virtues of Salah, Quran recitation, Dhikr, Tabligh, and Ramadan, it has been read in homes and masajid worldwide for generations, nurturing love for the Prophet ﷺ and devotion to Allah ﷻ.

The purpose of this page is simple yet profound: to bring the timeless wisdom of authentic Hadith to every Muslim — man, woman, and child — so that we may all live a complete, beautiful Islamic lifestyle rooted in Prophetic guidance. # Hadith for General Muslim Life — Foundations of Faith

The Prophetic traditions below form the bedrock of a Muslim's daily existence. They remind us that true success lies not in grand gestures alone, but in the sincerity behind every action, the gentleness of our character, and the mercy we extend to all of Allah's creation.



## Sincerity of Intention

*"Actions are judged by intentions, and every person shall have only what they intended."* — Sahih al-Bukhari & Muslim

This foundational Hadith from *Riyad-us-Saliheen* teaches us that the value of every deed — from prayer to charity to daily work — depends entirely on the sincerity within the heart. A small act done purely for Allah ﷻ outweighs mountains of deeds performed for worldly recognition. Let us purify our intentions before every action.



## Good Character

*"The heaviest thing placed on the Scale on the Day of Judgment is good character."* — Sunan al-Tirmidhi

Beautiful manners are not merely social niceties — they are among the weightiest deeds before Allah ﷻ. The Prophet ﷺ embodied the finest character, and he taught that gentleness, honesty, patience, and a cheerful disposition elevate a believer's rank. Strive to be the person whose presence brings comfort and whose words bring peace.



## Mercy & Kindness

*"Whoever is not merciful to others will not be shown mercy."* — Sahih al-Bukhari & Muslim

The mercy of the Prophet ﷺ extended to every living being — to children, to the elderly, to animals, and even to those who opposed him. This Hadith reminds us that divine mercy is earned through extending mercy to others. In every interaction, let compassion be our first response and kindness our lasting impression.

# Hadith for Men — Guardianship, Responsibility & Gentleness

Islam places upon men a noble responsibility: to be shepherds over their households, providers of safety, and exemplars of kindness. The Prophet ﷺ — the greatest of all men — was known to help at home, treat his wives with tenderness, and nurture his children with love. These Hadith remind every Muslim man that true strength lies in service, justice, and compassion.

## The Shepherd of His Household

*"Each of you is a shepherd, and each of you is responsible for his flock. The leader is a shepherd over his people and is responsible for them. A man is a shepherd over his household and is responsible for them."* —  
Riyad-us-Saliheen (Bukhari & Muslim)

This Hadith establishes that leadership in Islam is not about authority for its own sake — it is about accountability before Allah ﷻ. A Muslim man's role as head of household is a sacred trust (*amanah*). He must provide, protect, educate, and guide with wisdom and patience. On the Day of Judgment, he will be asked about every soul placed under his care.

## Kindness to One's Wife

*"The best of you are those who are best to their wives, and I am the best of you to my wives."* — Sunan al-Tirmidhi

The Prophet ﷺ set the highest standard of marital kindness. He helped with housework, spoke gently, and never raised his hand against any of his wives. He taught that a man's treatment of his wife is a direct reflection of his faith and character. Every husband should aspire to embody this Prophetic tenderness in his home.

# Hadith for Women & Girls — Honor, Modesty & Nurturing Light

Islam elevated the status of women at a time when the world denied them basic rights. The Prophet ﷺ honored women as mothers, daughters, wives, and scholars. These Hadith celebrate the dignity of Muslim women and the immense reward promised to those who raise daughters with love and righteousness.

## The Dignity of Women

*"Women are the twin halves of men."*  
— Sunan Abu Dawud & Tirmidhi

This beautiful narration affirms that men and women are counterparts — equal in spiritual worth, complementary in their roles. Islam does not diminish women; rather, it honors them with rights, respect, and a station of immense spiritual potential. Every woman who fulfills her duties with faith is among the noblest of creation.

## The Beauty of Modesty

*"Modesty is a branch of faith."* —  
Sahih Muslim

Modesty (*haya*) in Islam encompasses far more than clothing — it is a quality of the heart that shapes one's speech, gaze, conduct, and entire way of being. The Prophet ﷺ described it as an adornment that beautifies everything it touches. For the believing woman, modesty is not a restriction but a crown of dignity and inner strength.

## The Blessing of Raising Daughters

*"Whoever raises two daughters with kindness and provides for them, he and I will be together in Jannah like this"* — and he ﷺ joined his two fingers together. — Riyad-us-Saliheen (Muslim)

In a world that once buried daughters alive, the Prophet ﷺ promised the highest companionship in Paradise to those who raise girls with love, patience, and Islamic education. Every father and mother blessed with daughters should rejoice — for in nurturing them lies a direct path to the nearness of the Messenger of Allah ﷺ.

# Hadith for Boys & Children — Planting Seeds of Righteousness

The early years of a child's life are the most fertile soil for faith. The Prophet ﷺ emphasized that the greatest gift parents can bestow upon their children is not wealth or status, but proper manners, Islamic knowledge, and a deep connection with Allah ﷻ. These Hadith illuminate the sacred responsibility of raising the next generation.



## The Gift of Good Manners

*"The best gift from a father to his child is proper manners and good upbringing."* — Sunan al-Tirmidhi

Material gifts perish, but the gift of *adab* (proper conduct) endures in this life and the next.



## Paradise Under Mother's Feet

*"Paradise lies under the feet of your mother."* — Sunan al-Nasa'i


Teaching children to honor, obey, and love their mothers is one of the most important duties in Islam.

Establishing Salah early nurtures discipline, consciousness of Allah, and lifelong spiritual habits.




## Nurturing the Young Heart

The Prophet ﷺ was extraordinarily loving toward children. He would carry his grandchildren during prayer, kiss them openly, and play with them in the streets of Madinah. He once told a man who boasted of never kissing his children: *"What can I do for you if Allah has removed mercy from your heart?"*

Every child who memorizes a Hadith, learns to make dua, or shows kindness to a friend is building a fortress of faith that will protect them through life's trials. Parents and educators: invest in their souls, and you invest in your own Akhirah.

# Hadith on Ibadah – The Pillars of Worship

Worship (*ibadah*) is the very purpose of our creation. Allah ﷻ says: *"I did not create jinn and mankind except to worship Me."* (Quran 51:56). The Hadith below remind us of the supreme importance of Salah and Quran — the two pillars that anchor a Muslim's spiritual life and connect the servant to the Lord of all worlds.



## The Virtue of Salah

*"The first thing a person will be judged for on the Day of Judgment is Salah. If it is sound, all other deeds will be sound. If it is corrupt, all other deeds will be corrupt."* — Sunan al-Tabarani


Salah is the believer's direct audience with Allah ﷻ — five times daily, the servant stands before the Creator in humility and devotion. It is the dividing line between faith and disbelief, the coolness of the Prophet's eyes, and the first deed to be examined on the Day of Reckoning. Guard your prayers, and everything else in your life will find its balance.



## The Virtue of the Quran


*"The best among you are those who learn the Quran and teach it."* — Sahih al-Bukhari


Five Daily Prayers

## 🌙 Fasting — A Sacred Secret

*"Fasting is for Me, and I shall reward it."* —  
Hadith Qudsi (Bukhari & Muslim)

Unlike other acts of worship, fasting is a private devotion between the servant and Allah. Its reward is beyond calculation — known only to the Most Generous.

## 😊 Smiling — The Easiest Charity

*"Smiling at your brother is charity."* —  
Sunan al-Tirmidhi

Islam teaches that even the simplest kindness carries spiritual weight. A genuine smile can brighten a heart and earn reward from Allah ﷻ.

## 🤝 Brotherhood — True Faith

*"None of you truly believes until he loves for his brother what he loves for himself."* —  
Sahih al-Bukhari & Muslim

The Muslim community (*Ummah*) is one body. When one part suffers, the whole body responds with compassion and aid.

The Prophet ﷺ was the most generous of all people, and he was at his most generous during Ramadan. He taught that breaking someone's fast earns the same reward as the one fasting, and that feeding the hungry, visiting the sick, and greeting others with warmth are all forms of worship that build the bonds of a strong, loving community.

# Hadith on Charity, Patience, Dua & the Akhirah

Life in this world is a fleeting journey — a test of faith, patience, and generosity. The Prophet ﷺ taught us how to navigate every trial with trust in Allah, how to invest in our eternal future through ongoing charity, and how to arm ourselves with the most powerful weapon given to a believer: sincere dua.

## Ongoing Charity (*Sadaqah Jariyah*)

*"When a person dies, their deeds end except for three: ongoing charity, beneficial knowledge, and a righteous child who prays for them."* — Sahih Muslim

This Hadith inspires us to invest in deeds that continue benefiting others long after we are gone — building wells, funding education, and raising pious children.

## The Light of Patience

*"Patience is light."* — Sahih Muslim

In moments of loss, illness, or hardship, patience (*sabr*) illuminates the believer's path. It transforms suffering into reward, difficulty into growth, and despair into hope in Allah's infinite wisdom.

## Dua — The Weapon of the Believer

*"Dua is the weapon of the believer, the pillar of religion, and the light of the heavens and earth."* — Mustadrak al-Hakim

Never underestimate the power of raising your hands to Allah. Dua changes destinies, removes afflictions, and draws the servant closer to the Most Merciful.


